

Global Enterprise Experience Journal Requirements

Participants need to submit a one page journal sharing their insights from the Global Enterprise Experience to be eligible for any prizes, certificates, or letters of recommendation. The journal is evidence of participation in the team and the contest.

It is also a learning experience. The contest aims to develop participants' skills and experience to become global leaders who can work in partnership with diverse peoples to make a difference. Reflecting on what did and didn't work in this challenge is part of becoming a global leader.

The journal may consider many aspects of the experience, such as:

- What happened?
- What felt good, what drove you mad?
- What communication systems worked, what didn't?
- How did differences in culture, world views, levels of wealth and poverty, and access to the internet affect the team? In what way did this bring strengths and in what way did it bring challenges to the team?
- In what way have you grown from the experience – or are you just more tired and jaded?
- Has your understanding changed of how people in other parts of the world live?
- Did this year's challenge get you thinking or learning about new ideas?
- What insights did you get from the experience on what your country or the planet needs to be able to successfully work in partnership for progress?
- What other thoughts, feelings and insights flitted through your head as a result of doing this contest?
- If you were the leader, what was your leadership experience, what did you try, what worked and didn't work, what did you learn about yourself and leadership?
- If you are a member of a team, and felt you needed to influence the leadership or take a leadership role, how did you do that, what worked or didn't work, and what did you learn about yourself?
- Anything else?

This journal needs to be submitted to deb@windeaters.co.nz on Wednesday April 13th. It is on time so long as it is the 13th anywhere in the world.

On the journal please include your name, country in which you are currently living, personal ID for the contest and whether English is a first or second language. The judges try to take account of whether English is a first language in comparing the quality of journals.

Please save your journal with your personal ID for the contest, your name, your country and the word 'journal'. Eg "P501 Deb Gilbertson New Zealand Journal".
